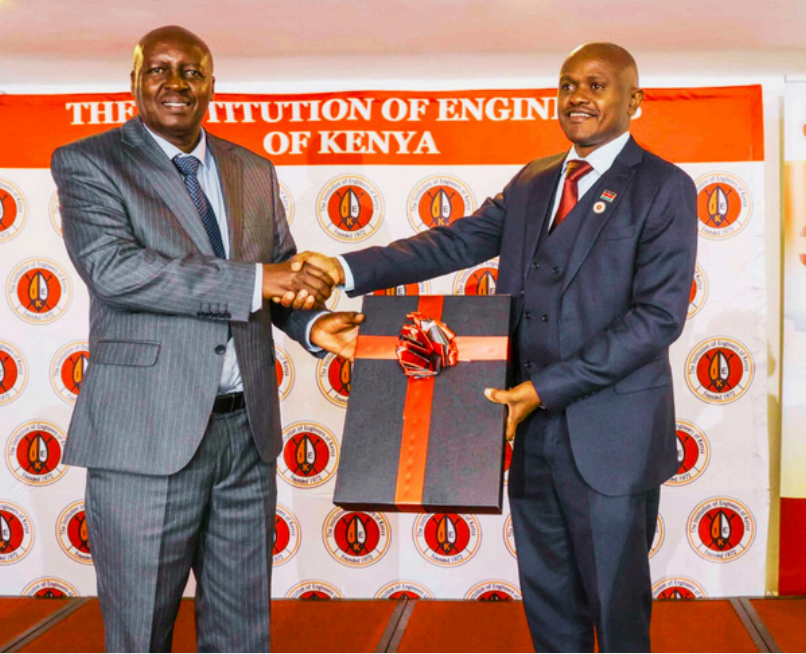

IEK Holds Special General Meeting Friday, 7th November 2025

The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK), held a significant Special General Meeting (SGM) at All Saints Cathedral, Nairobi.

This crucial gathering was intended to address key updates, primarily focusing on the Draft IEK Constitution.

During the SGM, members convened to discuss the proposed changes and other important matters directly impacting the engineering profession in Kenya. It served as a vital platform for engineers to voice their opinions, debate the constitutional draft, and collectively shape the future governance and operations of the IEK.

This engagement ensured that all members had an opportunity to contribute to the foundational document of their professional body.





IEK Submits Views On The Energy (Amendment) Bill to The Senate Committee On Energy.

Thursday, 6th November 2025

The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK), participated in a stakeholder engagement convened by the Senate Standing Committee on Energy to deliberate on the Energy (Amendment) Bill, 2025 (Senate Bills No. 11 of 2025). The session, held at Bunge Tower, was chaired by the Vice Chairperson of the Committee, Senator Hon. William Kisang (Elgeyo Marakwet County), and attended by Senator Hon. Edwin Sifuna (Nairobi County) and Senator Hon. Dr. Boni Khalwale (Kakamega County), among other members.

IEK was represented by its President, Eng. Shammah Kiteme, accompanied by IEK Council Member Eng. Alietias Msonda, Mr. Dennis Kiunga and Mr. Masile Yetu, who jointly presented the Institution's memorandum and articulated IEK's professional position on the proposed amendments. In its submission, IEK raised key concerns regarding proposed provisions on levies and regulatory approvals for energy infrastructure, noting that allowing county governments to impose wayleave

levies would significantly raise the cost of energy projects and burden consumers. The IEK emphasized that:

- Clause 233 should be retained in its current form, as allowing counties to impose levies on wayleaves is counterproductive and would escalate project and consumer energy costs.
- IEK recommended that counties instead develop bylaws to address wayleave maintenance issues rather than introducing new charges.
- Clauses 223 and 224 risk creating double taxation and overregulation, and IEK called for a single national approval framework to streamline processes.
- IEK further observed that the proposed amendment under Section 2(2) could increase trenching and wayleave costs, adversely affecting electricity access and affordability.

IEK urged the Senate to ensure that any amendments to the Energy Act promote coherence in governance, safeguard electricity affordability, and support Kenya's industrial and socio-economic

growth objectives.

As the voice of the engineer, the Institution reaffirmed its commitment to providing expert technical input to strengthen energy policy and legislative frameworks that drive sustainable national development.





IEK Participates in the Russisan-African Raw Materials Dialogue

Wednesday 29th October - Saturday 1st November 2025

The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) held in Empress Catherine II Mining University of St. Petersburg University, Russia. This dialogue was attended by more than 500 participants from over 40 countries and 130 organizations. The dialogue focused on path of development; raw materials and human capital as the foundation of economic sovereignty.

This conversation saw Eng. Shammah Kiteme the IEK President give key note address and participate in panel discussions exploring ways to achieve knowledge, energy, resources and technological sovereignty in which African economies will transition from agrarian to industrial economies.

Also attending the forum was Eng. Prof. Christopher Maina who gave a keynote presentation on the training of the engineers for the future. In discussi-

ons spearheaded by the Kenyan Ambassador to Russia, the Russian government has undertaken to increase the scholarship opportunities to Kenyans from the current 60 to 200 annually. This presents a good opening for Kenyan Engineers keen to further their Engineering Education in some of the best universities in the world.

The Russian engineering training has integrated advanced technologies like Virtual Reality, Digital twins and Machine learning which includes actual filed simulations to enhance; earning experiences and these would be excellent learning opportunities for Engineers besides vital cultural experiences at international level.

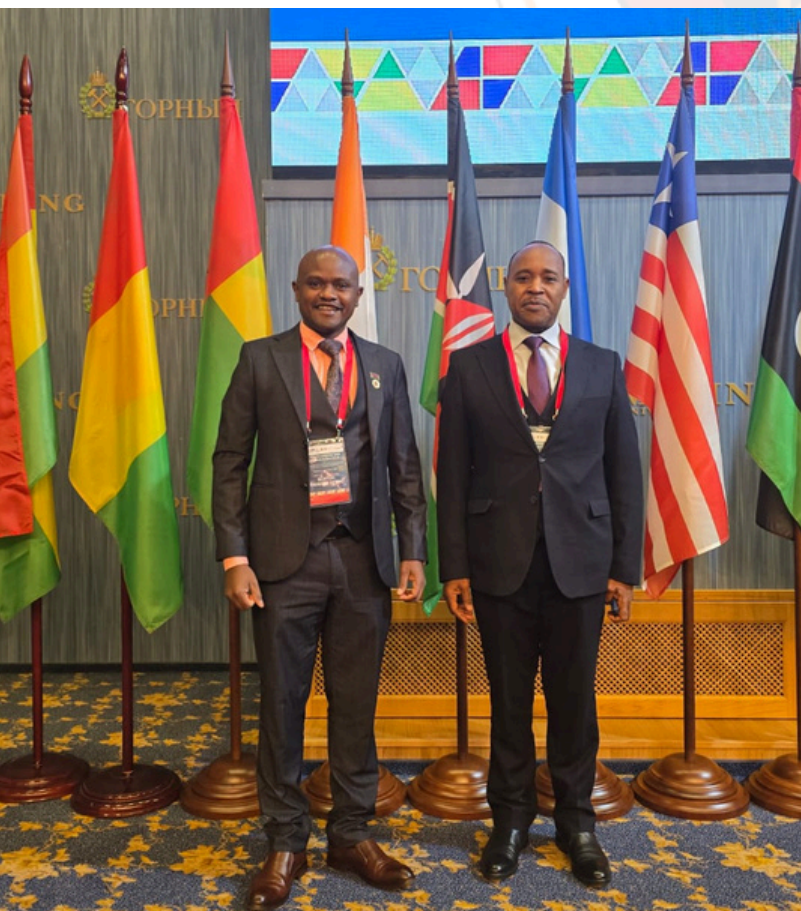
To enhance this partnership further, IEK has signed a memorandum of understanding with the National

Association of Mining Engineers of Russia. The MoU spells out areas of collaboration and these include a partnership to achieve the sustainable development goals but also working together to foster professional and technical exchange between engineers in Kenya and Mining experts in Russia.

There will be a joint development and delivery of Continuous Professional Development (CPD) programs, exchange programs for students and professionals, working jointly for regional and international collaboration in mining and industrial advancement. Finally, the partnership will include contribution to the development of the International Standard for Mining Engineers as a partner of the joint project between NAME and the International Center for Mining Engineering Education under the auspices of UNESCO among other areas of collaboration.

The event brought together industry leaders and experts to explore emerging opportunities in Kenya's construction and infrastructure sectors.

IEK Honorary Secretary, Eng. Jacton Mwembe, featured as a panelist in the session titled "Delivering Kenya's Affordable Housing Vision with Best Practice in Structural Engineering." In his presentation, Eng. Mwembe highlighted the critical role of structural engineers in advancing the affordable housing agenda. He underscored the importance of collaboration, innovation, and adherence to engineering standards to ensure safe, cost-effective, and sustainable housing solutions that align with the country's development goals.

Eng. Mwembe also represented the IEK President, Eng. Shammah Kiteme, in delivering remarks on "The Future of Structural Engineering in Kenya: Resilience, Innovation, and Sustainability." On behalf of the President, he emphasized the need for the engineering profession to embrace modern

The Engineers' Corner

Eng. Robert Ouko Oyoo - Civil Engineer, Assistant Director -
Department for Slum Upgrading



1. What inspired you to pursue civil engineering?

I discovered early on that I excelled in mathematics and sciences, which naturally drew me toward STEM fields like Engineering and Computer Science. With guidance from my brother already in STEM, I had to choose between the two. My passion for forces and momentum in Physics, inspired by Sir Isaac Newton's laws of motion, ultimately led me to pursue Civil Engineering for its diverse areas of specialization.

2. If you weren't an engineer, what career path would have been your second choice?

A Computer Scientist whose role would be in software development.

3. You've worn many hats, from lecturer to Centre Leader and now Assistant Director for Slum Upgrading. How has that journey been for you?

I began my career in May 2016 as an Assistant Site Engineer on a construction site in Kiambu County, later working on road projects in Machakos County. In October 2017, I joined KIHBT as Lecturer (II) in the State Dept. for Roads, rising to Lecturer (I) and then Principal Lecturer.

While at KIHBT, I served as Monitoring and Evaluation lead for the World Bank's EASTRIP project and was later appointed Centre Leader, coordinating the project and stakeholders for six months. Subsequently, I was promoted through the Public Service Commission to Assistant

Director, Slum Upgrading in the Ministry of Lands, Public Works, Housing and Urban Development. Much of my growth is thanks to my mentors, including Eng. Maurice Nabende, Eng. Henry Nyakwaka, and Arch. Geoffrey M. Githiri.

4. From an engineer's point of view, what makes slum upgrading different from other construction projects?

In the slum upgrading department, we focus on provision social housing and civil infrastructure to the most vulnerable groups of citizens in the most fragile living neighbourhoods. Most critically, accurate feasibility studies and social and economic justification of such projects is unavoidable to realize the objectives. In another sense, adequate stakeholder engagement and management is paramount for projects in informal settlement (slums).

5. Are there any new technologies or building methods you're excited about right now?

Currently, I am excited that the country has dedicated affordable housing finance which is complimentary to the donor support to alleviate poverty and disease in then vulnerable neighbourhoods. I would be interested to contribute through but certainly the use of EPS panels has significantly reduced the time of implementation of some projects.

6. If you could go back to university, what's one non-engineering subject you'd love to study just for fun?

I would definitely go for Sociology which will equip me with adequate skills to implement Resettlement Action Plans (RAP) and management project affected persons (PAPs).

7. If civil engineering were a movie genre, what would it be, action, sci-fi, drama or documentary? And why?

Definitely action movie since we majorly determine

forces and moments on structures and provide safe system or load paths to absorb and dissipate to the natural ground without causing any damage or unwanted service levels like noise and excessive vibrations.

8. What was the biggest surprise you encountered in your early years as a young engineer entering the workforce?

As a young engineer, my biggest surprise was that I had to learn and unlearn some things in my career under the supervision of experienced foremen. Also, I was amazed by the various roles a Civil Engineer can play depending on your background and specialisation. Some of these roles include but are not limited to; Structural Engineer, Bridge Engineer, Traffic Engineer, Transportation Engineer, Transport Specialist, Road Safety Engineer, Geotechnical Engineer, Materials or Pavement Engineer, Highway Engineer, CAD Engineer, Transport Economist and Water and Sanitation Engineer, Railway Engineer, Port Engineer and Airport/Aerodrome Engineer

9. What's the most fulfilling part of your current role?

In my current role, I provide technical assistance to the Director, Slum Upgrading by providing input in project management roles. I also provide civil and structural engineering design reviews and contract management for the social housing infrastructure projects.

10. What advice would you give young engineers aspiring to pursue civil engineering?

Civil Engineering is the best engineering course due to the diverse areas of specialisation and our role in creating a better world for animals, plants and mankind in an ecosystem.

11. What's a fun fact about you that even your colleagues might be surprised to know?

The fun fact about me is multitasking in teaching, research, practice and socialising after work.

12. Do you have a favourite sport, and if so, which team are you cheering for?

I love soccer and I am a proud fan of Gor Mahia in Kenya and Manchester United for the English Premier League and Real Madrid in the La Liga.

13. If you had a superpower to make your work easier (or life more fun), what would it be?

Integrating AI in design processes and innovation to solve the world's most unspoken pandemic of road accidents.

14. If you could instantly learn a new skill (non-engineering), what would it be?

I would learn how to play Chess which will help me develop a better work life balance approach.

15. If you were commissioned to design a monument for Kenya at 100 years, what would it be, and which county would you have it placed in?

I would definitely design a statute for the Rt. Hon. Eng. Raila Amollo Odinga, C.G.H with the 2010 Constitution of Kenya engraved on his hand and the people of Kenya. I would prefer it be installed in all counties or just Nairobi.

Rewarding.

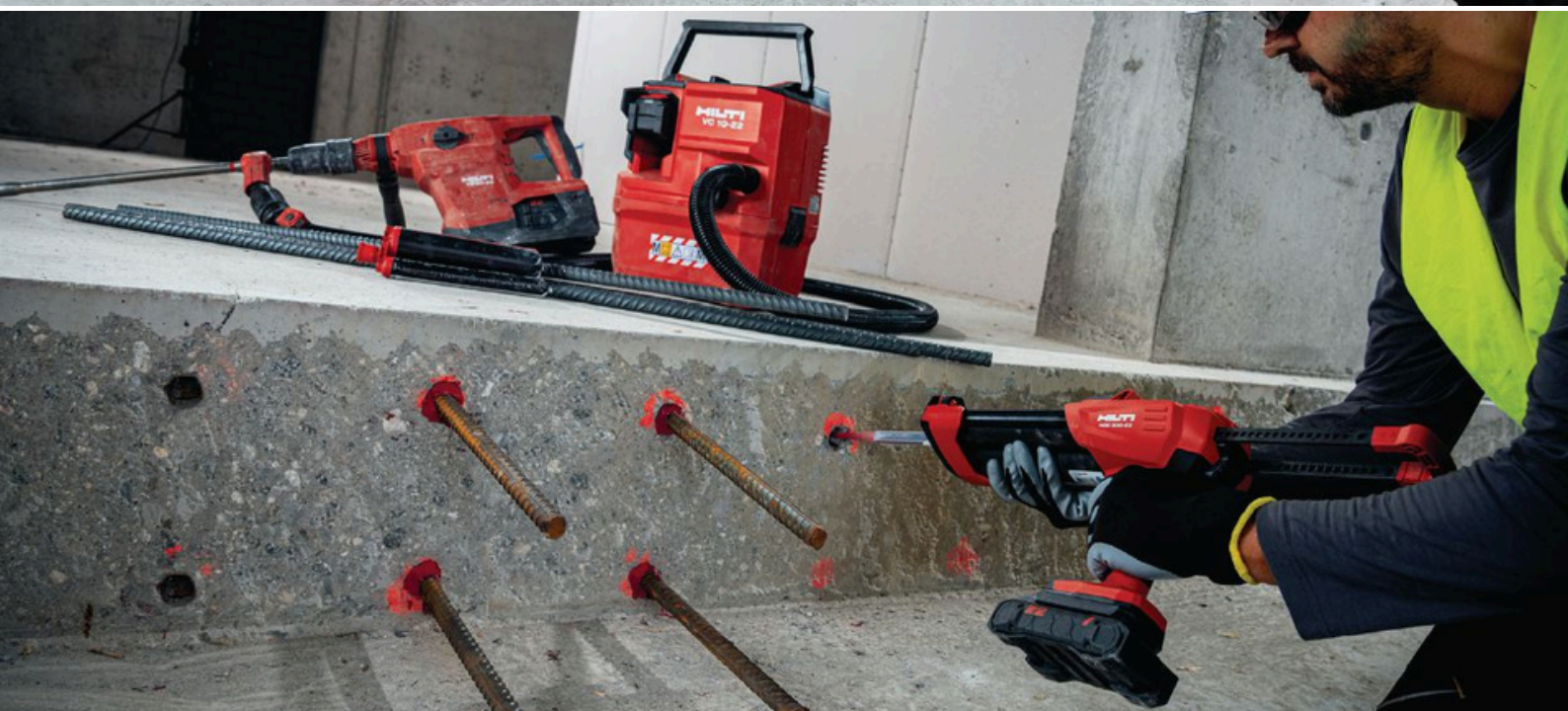
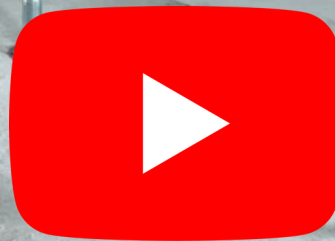
