The intensive programme brought together professionals from various sectors to explore best practices in structuring, financing, and managing PPP projects in Kenya.

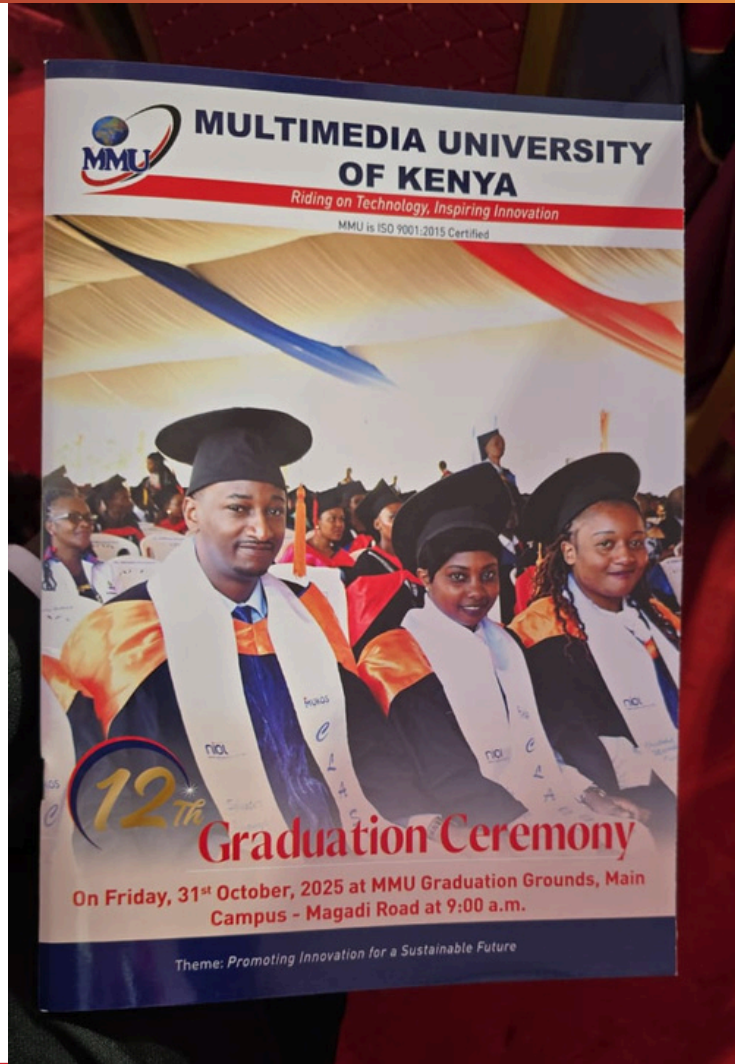

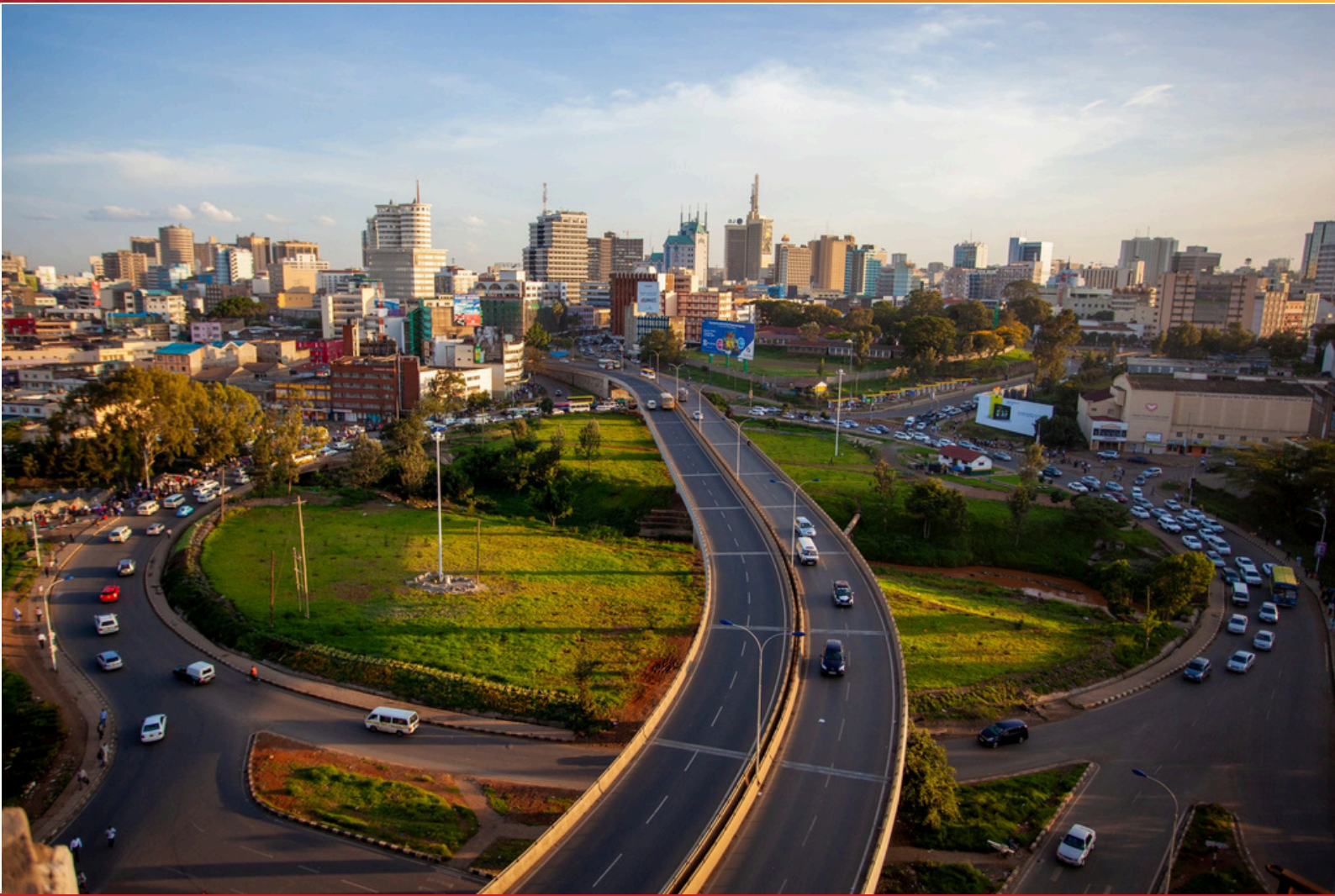

## IEK Calls for Transparency and Due Process in Kenya Roads Board Leadership Changes

Friday, 31<sup>st</sup> October 2025

**T**he Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) has voiced serious concern over recent management changes at the Kenya Roads Board (KRB), following an internal memo issued on 29th October 2025 announcing the end of term of CPA Rashid Mohamed, MBS, and the appointment of Eng. Isaac Maina as Acting Director General. Barely a day later, further changes were announced that appeared to reverse this appointment developments that have caused significant unease within the engineering fraternity.

IEK, as the learned society representing engineers across the country, has urged all parties involved to ensure that leadership transitions within such critical public institutions are handled with transparency,

professionalism, and adherence to due process.

The Institution further expressed unease over the 2019 amendment to the KRB Act, which removed the requirement for the Director General to be a Civil Engineer. According to IEK, this change coupled with the recent developments signals a worrying trend that could weaken professional leadership and compromise the Board's technical oversight.

"Having no engineer at the helm or within the Board undermines the strategic function of KRB," IEK added. "We urge the Cabinet Secretary for Roads and Transport to address this gap immediately to restore confidence and stability."



## IEK Calls for Stronger Measures to Enhance Bus and Road Safety in Kenya

Monday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2025

**T**he Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) has issued a strong call for urgent action to enhance the safety of buses and improve road safety in Kenya. The statement comes amid rising concern over increasing road fatalities, with the National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA) reporting over 2,933 deaths by August 2025 alone.

According to IEK, poor vehicle conditions, structural weaknesses, and weak enforcement of standards are among the leading causes of accidents. The Institution noted that mechanical failures and unsafe vehicle designs account for nearly 10% of annual road deaths, with an estimated economic cost exceeding KSh 300 billion each year.

### Vehicle Condition and Safety Standards

IEK highlighted the crucial role of vehicle integrity in reducing crashes, citing recurring cases of worn-out tyres, faulty brakes, and compromised structures in public service vehicles (PSVs). Incidents such as the August 2024 Nakuru bus accident that claimed 18 lives, and the August 2025 Kisumu school bus

tragedy that left over 20 dead, have drawn attention to the dangers posed by structurally weakened buses — many of which were built before Kenya enforced modern safety standards.

### IEK's Recommendations

To improve passenger safety and curb road carnage, IEK recommends:

- Regular in-service inspections to ensure vehicles meet safety standards.
- Updating standards to reflect international best practices.
- Promoting dedicated bus chassis over truck adaptations for greater stability.
- Introducing crashworthiness testing and revalidation certification for PSVs.
- Establishing digitized data-sharing systems among NTSA, KEBS, and KENAS for efficient monitoring.
- Raising public awareness on the benefits of compliant and roadworthy vehicles.

## The Engineers' Corner

Eng. Robert Otieno Ogallo - Managing Director,  
Noitech Engineering Ltd.



### 1. Reflecting on your early career, what was one pivotal moment that solidified your passion for engineering?

The turning point came during my first attachment at the Kisumu Airport Rehabilitation Project with the Netherlands Airport Consultants. It exposed me to the scale of civil engineering and the importance of quality management. Monitoring works and reviewing procedures showed me how every decision impacts safety and performance. That experience revealed the responsibility engineering carries and cemented my passion for excellence in the field.

### 2. Did you have a dream career as a child, or did engineering surprise you along the way?

As a child, I dreamed of becoming a doctor to help people and make an impact. However, the high tuition fees and my discomfort with blood made me reconsider. That moment led me to engineering a surprising but perfect fit that let me pursue problem-solving and meaningful work without those challenges. Looking back, I believe engineering found me, and I've never looked back.

### 3. What was your first real job or internship, and what did it teach you about working in engineering?

My first real job was as a laboratory technician, conducting material tests for concrete, soils, and aggregates. It taught me the importance of accuracy, consistency, and adherence to standards, as even small oversights could lead to major issues. I developed a deep respect for data-

driven decision-making, and that experience laid the foundation for my commitment to quality management throughout my career.

### 4. What inspired you to specialize in geotechnical and foundation engineering?

My interest in geotechnical engineering began in high school while living in Nyahera village, where I was fascinated by lab equipment behind my grandfather's posho mill and often helped technicians with basic tests. Later, I volunteered with engineers from Itec and Mece Consulting on road design fieldwork, which deepened my interest. In university, I joined bridge investigations that sharpened my field skills. This journey led me to Lilac Engineering, where Eng. Howard M'Mayi entrusted me to coordinate major geotechnical investigations, including the Kenya-Ethiopia transmission line and complex building projects. These experiences confirmed my passion and set the foundation for my specialization in geotechnical engineering.

### 5. Were there any pivotal challenges or setbacks early in your career that shaped the way you approach engineering today?

In the past, engineering was seen as a solitary role, with little knowledge sharing or mentorship. Young engineers often learned through trial and error, and mistakes led to blame rather than growth. Limited technology also hindered efficiency and collaboration. Today, with e-learning and modern tools, knowledge is more accessible than ever. These early challenges shaped my focus on open communication, mentorship, and technology use to foster continuous learning, prevent issues, and build stronger, more resilient teams.

### 6. What personal qualities do you think have contributed most to your professional growth?

## The Engineers' Corner

Several personal qualities have driven my professional growth. Strong ethics have guided me to uphold integrity and accountability, while respect for mentors has helped me learn from their experience. I'm always eager to learn and grow holistically, aiming to become an all-round engineer who contributes across all project aspects. These traits have supported my continuous technical and professional development.

### **7. In your opinion, what are the biggest challenges facing geotechnical and foundation engineers in Kenya today?**

Many construction projects in Kenya face challenges from inadequate geotechnical investigations due to budget limits, tight timelines, and weak regulation enforcement. Developers often prioritize low costs over proper studies, treating investigations as formalities rather than essential design tools. Inconsistent regulation and unqualified individuals posing as engineers further compromise safety, with some even buying professional stamps for fake reports. To address this, the reactivated Kenya Geotechnical Society where I serve as Secretary is working to strengthen policies, uphold professional standards, and advance knowledge in the sector.

### **8. Looking back at your career, what achievements are you most proud of, and why?**

I've had the privilege of mentoring many engineers, technologists, and technicians, helping them grow professionally an experience that reinforces my belief in knowledge sharing and leadership development. Through the Noitech Engineering Foundation, I've also made a tangible impact by building 21 semi-permanent houses for underprivileged families and sponsoring students to pursue secondary and engineering education one of my proudest contributions to society.

### **9. What do you think is the most important lesson you try to pass on to those you mentor?**

While technical skills are vital, I believe we are first

human beings respect and dignity must guide our work. Ethics is crucial in engineering, as our decisions affect lives and communities. I encourage mentees to stay curious, adaptable, and committed to ethical responsibility, as true success comes from combining technical excellence with strong moral values.

### **10. If you could design a dream engineering project just for fun, what would it be?**

I would design an efficient, integrated transport system for Nairobi and its environs, featuring high-speed trains and smart traffic management to cut congestion and commute times. I'd also implement advanced waste management for cleaner, healthier living. The goal: a model urban area balancing technology, sustainability, and quality of life.

### **11. How do you usually recharge or reset after a long day of work?**

I enjoy chatting with my kids about their day, listening to my wife's endless stories, and getting daily hugs they make me happy. When I'm alone, I play loud music in the car after site meetings or unwind with a game of FIFA.

### **12. Can you recall a moment of laughter or lightheartedness at work that still makes you smile?**

Once, I was unexpectedly sent to meet an important client while not well-groomed. With no time to prepare, I quickly bought new clothes on the way. It was stressful, but the client appreciated my effort it taught me always to stay ready for surprises at work!

### **13. If you could instantly learn a new skill (non-engineering), what would it be?**

I'd choose to be a lawyer to skillfully apply facts and argue cases based on the constitution..

### **14. If one day you were asked to summarize your engineering journey in one word/phrase, what would it be?**

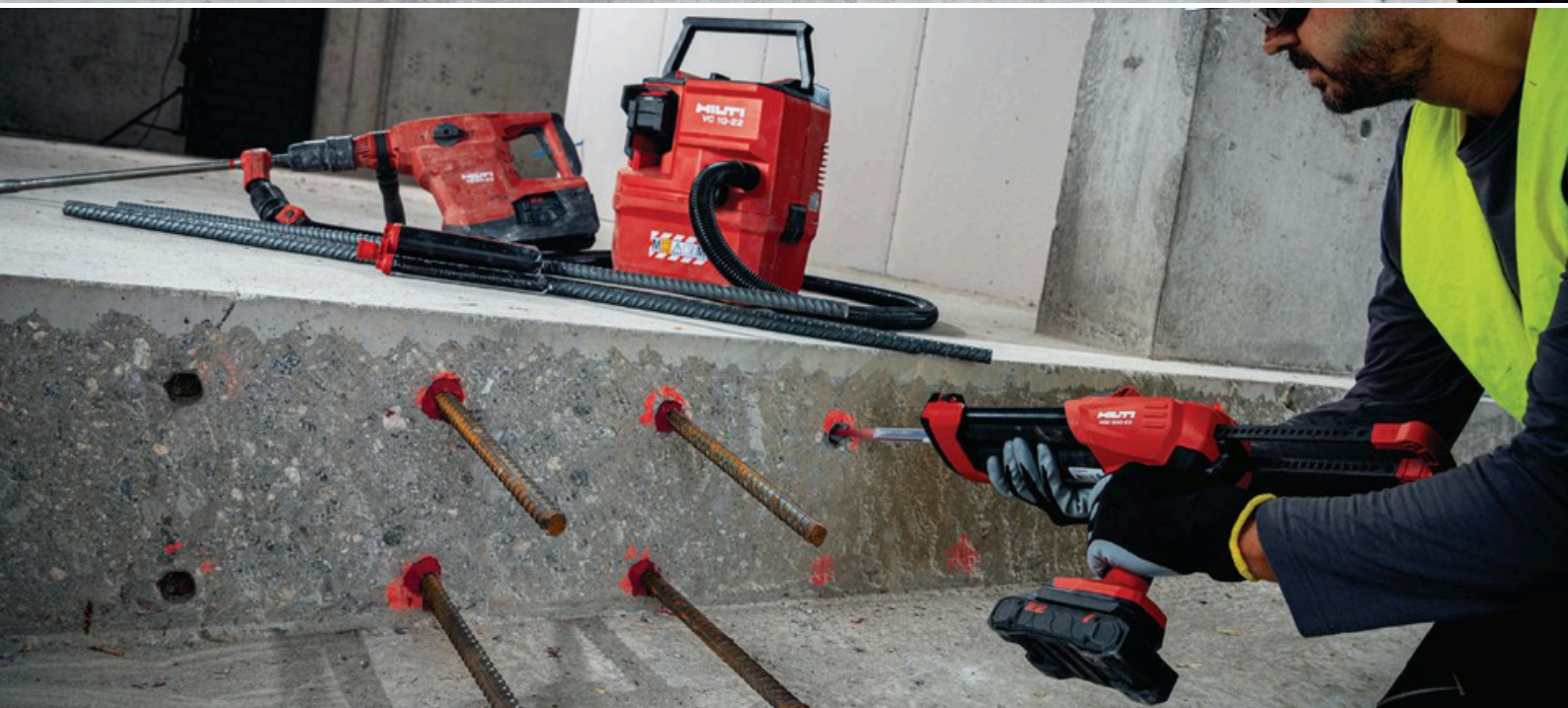
