New IEK Editorial Board Takes Office for 2025–2030 Term.

Tuesday, 16th December, 2025.

The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK), ushered in a new Editorial Board for the 2025–2030 term, reinforcing its commitment to knowledge leadership, ethical publishing, and thought leadership within the engineering profession. The newly constituted Board will be chaired by Eng. Prof. Alex Muumbo, who takes over leadership of IEK's editorial mandate for the next five years.

The inauguration, also attended by IEK President Eng. Shammah Kiteme, marked a seamless transition of leadership within the Institution's publishing board. It also provided an opportunity to formally recognise the outgoing Editorial Board, led by Eng. Prof. Lawrence Gumbe, whose tenure laid a strong foundation for growth, consistency, and credibility in IEK's publications which include Engineering in Kenya Magazine (EiK), The African Journal of Engineering Research and Innovation (AJERI), and the IEK Weekly Newsletter.

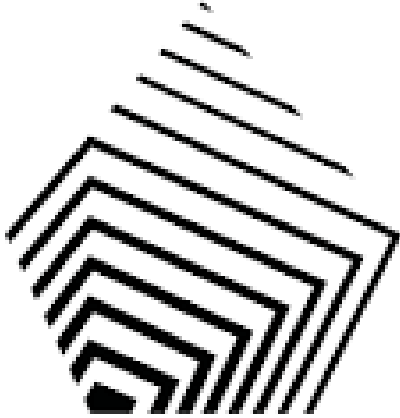

This event is a collaboration between the Royal Academy of Engineering, UNEP, AGSO, and Jacob’s Ladder Africa, and is funded by the UK Government’s Department for Science, Innovation and Technology.

1. Growing up, who was a person you admired (not necessarily an engineer), and why did they matter to you?

I admired Dr. Dan Gikonyo, who was the Guest of Honour at my school's Prize-Giving Ceremony in 2004. He asked, "What is today's Nation newspaper headline?" Only one parent answered, later noting he had simply taken the time to read. That lesson stayed with me. Though I once aspired to be a doctor, I eventually chose Civil Engineering. Over the years, I've developed a deep love for reading, especially fiction, which I now fondly call "my cigarette break."

2. Which moment in your youth made you feel proud of yourself, even in a small way?

I have contributed to and co-authored several publications, with my first published the year I turned 30. All my work has focused on road safety, inclusiveness, and equitable streets, which is something I truly love.

3. What was your first professional role after graduation?

I worked as an Assistant Materials Engineer on the Upgrading of the ICD Yard and Access Roads SGR Project, based on-site for about three years, before moving to the Design Office at APEC Consortium Limited. I loved the intensity of the work and its professional impact, and I remain grateful for the mentorship and occasional collaboration with seniors, even after leaving APEC.

4. Was there a moment early in your career when you thought, "Yes, this is exactly where I belong"?

Transportation Engineering has been a fascinating journey for me. I started as a highway engineer and later transitioned into transport planning, road safety, and street design, a shift that required a lot of learning and unlearning. Along the way, I gained a deeper appreciation of how the function of a place shapes road design and how our work directly affects safety and efficiency. Currently, I am especially focused on road safety from an infrastructure development perspective.

5. What first drew you into transport planning and municipal / highway engineering?

I began my career as a highway engineer, and working around the ICD roads drew me into transportation planning and municipal/highway engineering. Our team used Roads B and L daily for about three years while Road A was still under construction, which profoundly shaped my perspective on road design.

This experience made me more aware of diverse road users, particularly where heavy vehicles share space with pedestrians and cyclists. I gained insight into balancing vehicle movements, pavement durability, and turning geometries while ensuring the safety and dignity of non-motorised transport users. These lessons fostered my interest in transport planning, road safety, and inclusive, user-centred infrastructure, earning me the nickname "the NMT Engineer."

6. How has your work in transport and municipal engineering opened your eyes to issues of equity and inclusivity (for vulnerable road users, etc.)?

My perspective has changed: highways should be designed differently from urban and rural roads, with greater emphasis on inclusivity for all transport modes, even within right-of-way and budget constraints. While human error affects road safety, engineers play a key role because safety starts with the infrastructure we design.

I see sustainable mobility in two ways. In many Western and middle-income countries, it's driven by policies promoting public transport and active mobility. Locally, it's

about equity most people walk or use public transport out of necessity, yet infrastructure still prioritizes private vehicle users, who are a minority.

7. What would you say is a turning point or milestone in your professional growth something that marked a new level or change in how you work?

Working in an international organisation allowed me to engage with projects across several African countries, exposing me to diverse approaches to infrastructure development. While Kenya leads in overall coverage, I have been particularly impressed by urban projects in Ethiopia, Egypt, Rwanda, Tanzania, Ghana, and Zambia that prioritise inclusive design.

Since 2020, newly constructed footpaths in Addis Ababa, for example, have consistently included tactile paving and accessible ramps. This experience challenged the assumption that car-centric roads are solely due to budget or space constraints, suggesting instead that such designs may reflect deeper preferences or biases.

8. How do you ensure your projects remain resilient to future changes (urban growth, climate pressures, mobility trends)?

Surprisingly, designing roads with people in mind is an effective way to make infrastructure climate-responsive. By promoting safe walking and cycling, we reduce conflicts between transport modes, improve traffic flow, and encourage low-carbon mobility. Adding green spaces and landscaping along roads enhances aesthetics, creates carbon sinks, helps cool urban areas, and supports stormwater management. Embracing these fundamentals is a practical first step toward sustainable, climate conscious road design.

9. When you assessed proposals as a judge for the "Reshaping Transport" initiative, what criteria or innovations stood out to you?

I am still amazed at the effort involved in creating people-responsive designs, especially when designing for people is a critical criterion. This also happens a lot in World Bank sponsored projects. I wish we could channel that in all contexts into the projects we undertake daily.

10. Is there a quote or philosophy that guides your decisions or comforts you in times of stress?

I appreciate the retrospective perspective. Looking back, even the most chaotic moments often make sense, though they rarely feel clear in the midst of them. Over time, this has taught me to trust the process, even when it isn't easy.

11. If you had to teach a one-hour class on any topic other than engineering, what would it be about?

Literature. There is much to learn from it and breaking it down and analysing its depth can be a fulfilling experience.

12. If you could instantly learn a new skill (non-engineering), what would it be?

Learning another language.

13. If one day you were asked to summarize your engineering journey in one word/phrase, what would it be?

My engineering journey has been about learning to appreciate STEM, reevaluating my perspective on the arts, and becoming a better professional by focusing on the people we serve.

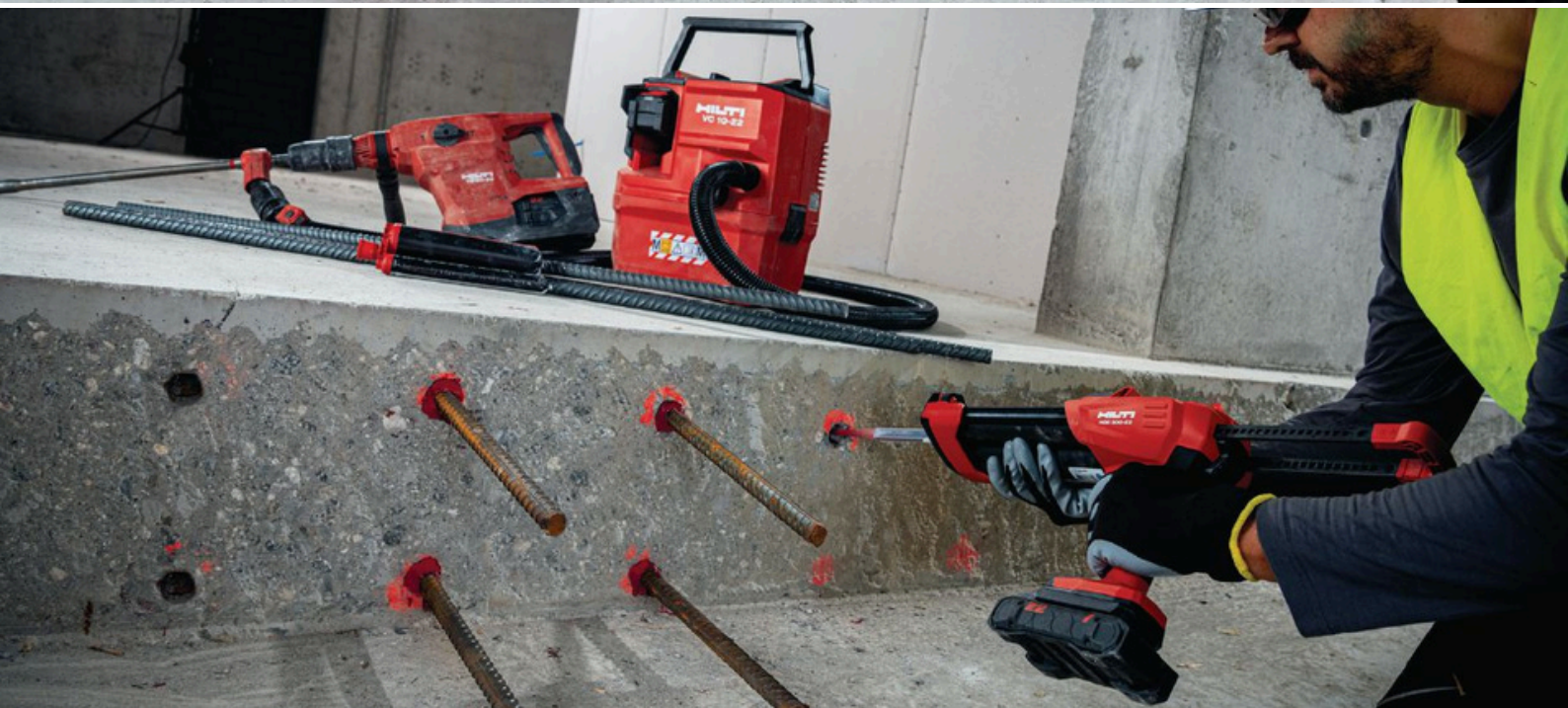
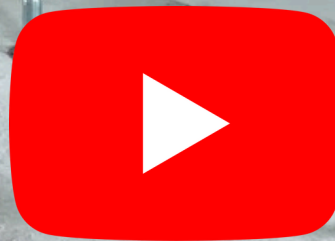
