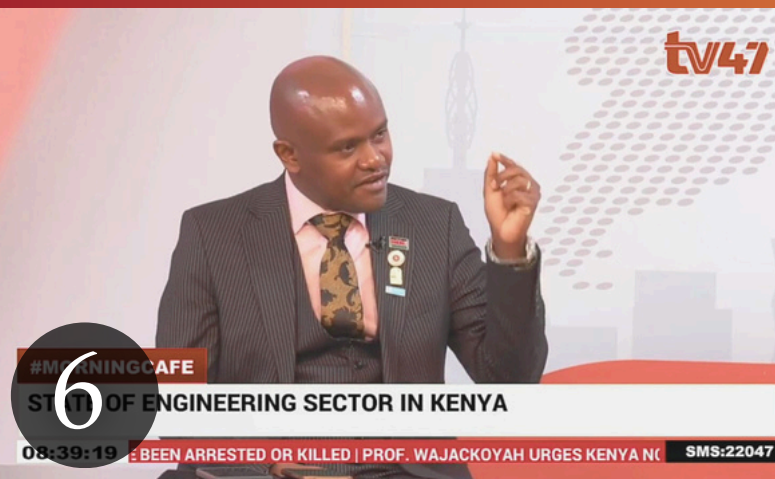

Wednesday, 12th November 2025



The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) engaged with the Embassy of the Russian Federation in Nairobi. The engagement was led by Eng. Shammah Kiteme, IEK President, and Eng. Prof. Christopher Maina Muriithi, IEK Council Member.

During the meeting, both parties explored several areas of collaboration between Kenyan and Russian industry and academia, including knowledge exchange and technical training.

The meeting also highlighted IEK's recent activities in St. Petersburg, Russia, where the institution signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the National Association of Mining Engineers (NAME) and participated in the Russian-African Dialogue on Raw Materials, held from 29th October to 1st November 2025.

As part of the ongoing partnership, 10 IEK members will be offered scholarships to undertake studies at leading Russian universities, strengthening professional development and fostering closer ties between the engineering communities of the two countries.

The engagement reflects IEK's dedication to fostering strategic international partnerships that enhance capacity development, drive innovation, and strengthen global engagement among Kenyan engineering professionals.

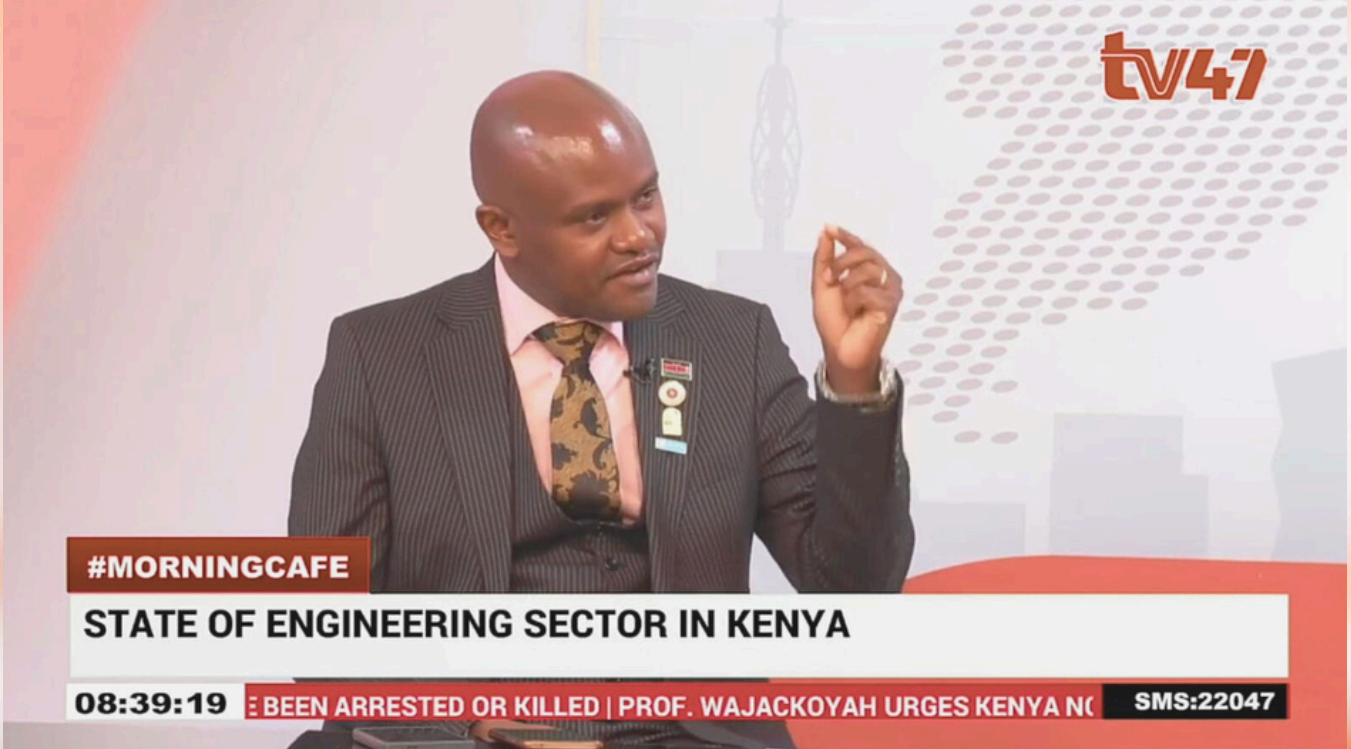

IEK President Highlights the State of Engineering Sector in Kenya on TV47.

Friday, 7th November 2025

The President of The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK), Eng. Shammah Kiteme, featured on TV47's #MorningCafe to shed light on the current state and future prospects of Kenya's engineering sector.

He highlighted the crucial role engineers play in infrastructure development, sustainable solutions, and driving economic growth nationwide.

During the interview, Eng. Shammah Kiteme noted that despite numerous ongoing infrastructure projects, about most of Kenyan engineers remain unemployed.

He pointed out that the majority of large-scale projects are managed by foreign firms, which limits opportunities for local engineers. Eng. Kiteme emphasized the inclusivity of IEK, which represents over 14,000 engineers across civil, electrical, mechanical, chemical, aeronautical, agricultural, mining, and mechatronic fields. He highlighted that industrialization and integrated infrastructure development could expand opportunities across all engineering disciplines.

The IEK President highlighted employment creation efforts, including a proposal to generate 10,000 engineering jobs based on realistic assessments of ongoing and planned projects in roads, buildings, energy, mining, aviation, agriculture, and irrigation. He added that a Memorandum detailing these proposals has been submitted to the President of Kenya, with follow-up awaiting action from the Cabinet Secretary for Labour.

Eng. Kiteme also emphasized the importance of improved terms of service in the public sector, mentorship, skills transfer for junior engineers, and adherence to procurement laws to ensure local engineers are engaged. He stressed that Kenyan engineers are highly qualified, capable of providing solutions while emphasizing the need for investment in STEM education, technology, manufacturing, agriculture, and energy to promote sustainable, locally-driven infrastructure.

IEK Participates in Advancing Safety in Construction through the GECR Kenya Roundtable.

Tuesday 11th -Thursday 13th November 2025

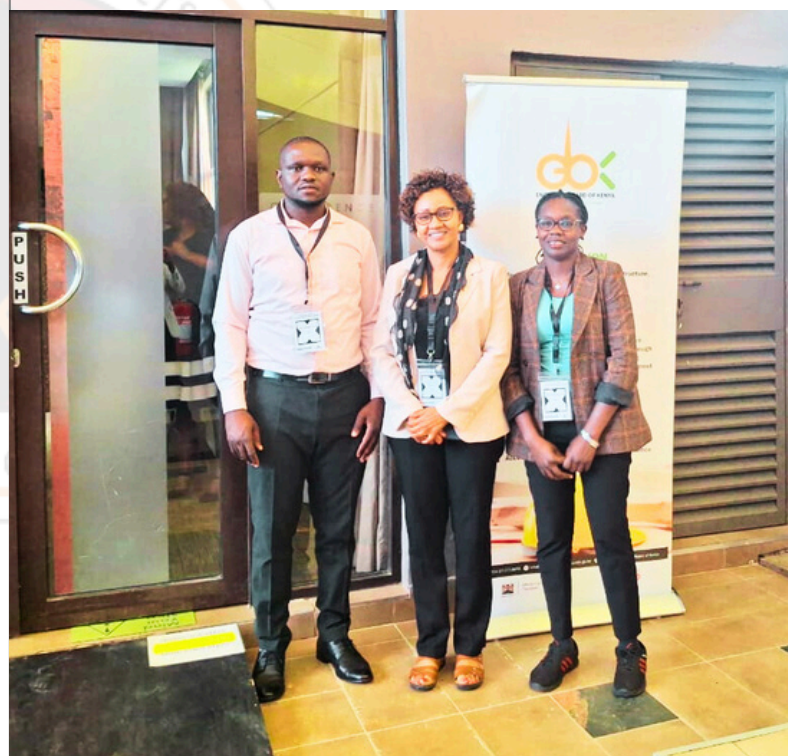
The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK), was part of a workshop themed 'Advancing Safety in Construction through Global Engineering Capability Review (GECR). The Roundtable was convened by the Engineers Board of Kenya (EBK) in partnership with the Royal Academy of Engineering in addition to other key stakeholders in the construction industry.

Participants were sensitized to the Global Engineering Capability Review, 2025 Report which is a landmark study that introduces a framework for measuring a nation's ability to conduct engineering practices safely and effectively.

The study was undertaken by Engineering X under its Skills for Safety programme, supported by the Royal Academy of Engineering and Lloyd's Register Foundation.

The main purpose of the Roundtable was to disseminate the report and receive feedback from the industry stakeholders.

The IEK's participation underscored the institution's commitment to continuous professional development and the elevation of safety standards within the Kenyan engineering fraternity.

IEK Engages in National Consultations Meeting on Liberalisation of Additional Services.

Monday 10th - Tuesday 11th November 2025



The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) was part of the high-level National Consultations Committee Meeting on the Liberalisation of Additional Services held at IBIS Hotel in Westlands.

This forum brought together various stakeholders to address the complex processes involved in liberalizing key service sectors, an action critical for aligning Kenya's domestic economic policies with regional and international trade agreements.

The consultations explored mechanisms for enhanced market access, which allows both domestic and international service providers to operate under new frameworks, and the rules governing the Movement of Natural Persons. This element is vital to the engineering profession as it determines how easily skilled engineers can operate across different countries participating in the agreements.

The overall objective was to outline policy positions that ensure Kenya complies with its commitments to regional bodies, such as the East African Community (EAC), while strategically positioning local engineering capacity for global competition.

A major point of deliberation was the necessity of maintaining robust domestic regulation to safeguard the quality and integrity of professional services during the liberalisation process. Participants were also briefed on the importance of enforcing stringent standards for all professionals, regardless of their origin, to protect public safety in infrastructure and construction projects.

More of the discussions focused on regulatory harmonization which is the process of aligning national licensing and certification rules with international best practices. This ensures that opening up the market does not lead to a compromise in quality or ethical practice.

The consultations also addressed how the liberalisation of services could serve as a powerful catalyst for economic growth and technological advancement. Experts discussed how increased foreign commercial presence could facilitate the transfer of modern technology, innovative construction methods, and advanced management practices into the Kenyan market.

IEK Members Visit China for 2025 Industrial Tour. Friday 7th November 2025 - Wednesday 19th November 2025

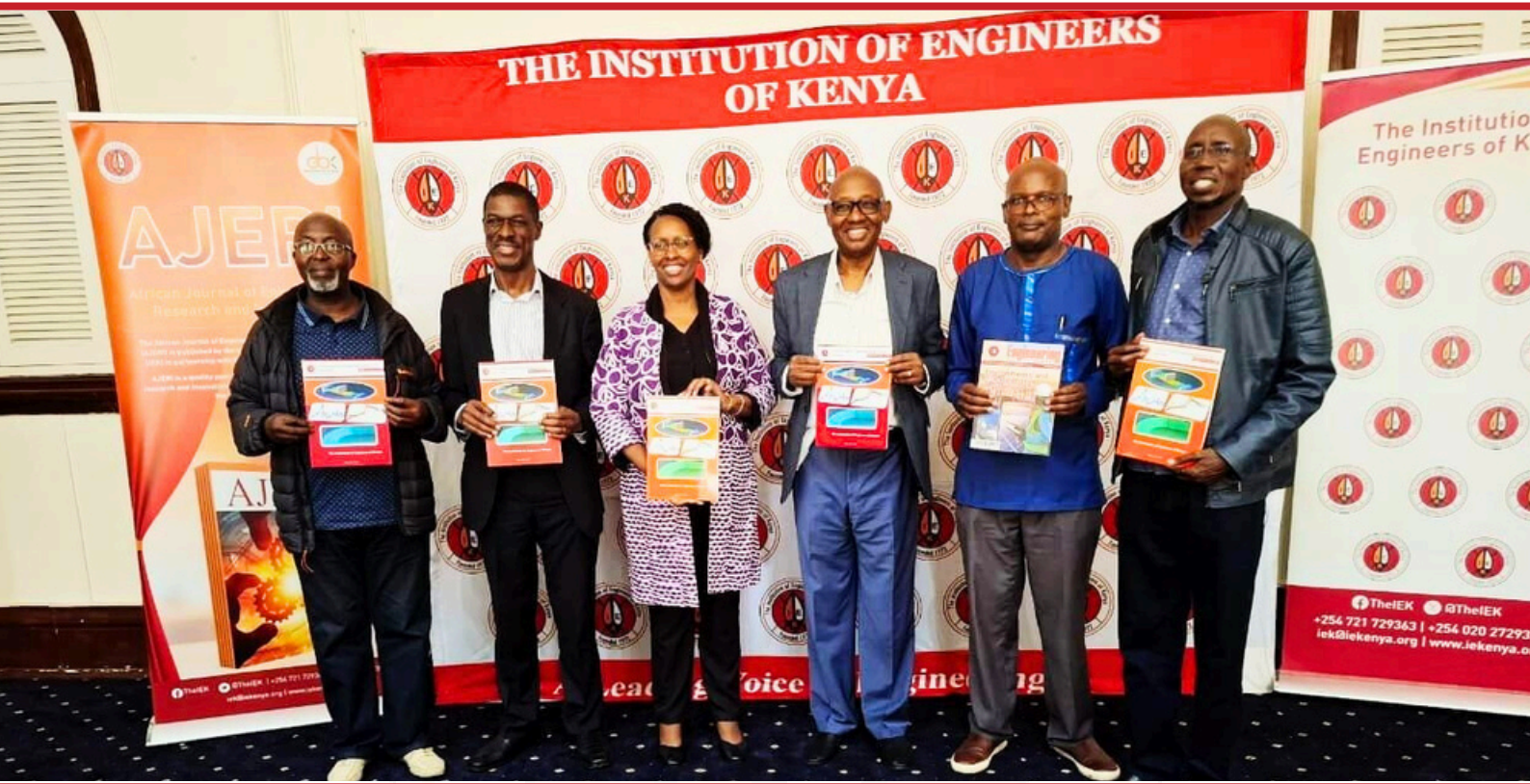

The Engineers' Corner

Eng. Nahashon Tambo - Honorary Registrar, Architectural Association of Kenya.



1. What motivated you to become an engineer in the first place?

I have a paternal uncle who is a seasoned Civil/Structural Engineer. I must admit that he was the inspiration to pursue the profession.

2. Outside engineering, what's one pursuit you've enjoyed that has helped you grow as a person?

Mountaineering. I have summited most peaks in Africa, notably Mt Kilimanjaro, Mt Speke, Mt Stanley -Margherita and Cheptegai peaks, Mt Kenya - Point John, Point Peter, Shipton's Peak and Point Lenana, Mt Meru, Mt Oldonyo Lengai and other smaller peaks in the Aberdare Ranges. Mountaineering really pushes me both mentally and physically. A big reason why I have such a formidable mindset.

3. Which skills from your first job have proven most valuable in your career?

Efficiency and attention to detail. I was trained very early in practice to always deliver work within agreed timelines and in the highest quality possible regardless of scope.

4. What was the biggest surprise you encountered then as a young engineer entering the workforce?

The realization that to be successful in engineering work in real life, you require good social/people skills. I had an epiphany moment when one of our lecturers in my

undergraduate classes used to say, "a successful engineer is a politician". To mean you need to be charismatic and know how to handle people, i.e. your prospective clients

5. Can you share a challenging project you encountered in the field and how you tackled it?

The most challenging project ultimately was the same one that gave me the most valuable skills set I have as a structural engineer to date. It involved refurbishing part of a hotel and putting up a new building. The catch is that all that was happening in an active hotel environment with all operations ongoing. I had to coordinate both the technical project implementation team and the hotel operator. It is a 5-star hotel in Nairobi City and a major franchise in the country.

6. What aspects of your current role excite you the most?

My current role as an Engineer in management is exciting because it involves sourcing project briefs, coordinating projects at a high level, dispute resolution in projects, drafting and interpreting contract documents during execution of projects etc.

7. What's one technical project you've worked on recently that you're particularly proud of?

A structural renovation of a laboratory building in a high school. We introduced a number of reinforced concrete columns to the building and vertically extended it by two floors.

8. Many engineers value continuous learning what technical training or certification has most boosted your skills?

A while back, I did a certification in structural steel design in Euro Codes of Practice.

9. With your professional track record, what's an innovation or technical approach you've personally championed in your projects?

It has to be a type of hybrid foundation I call "Frawall" system. It is an acronym for "Frame" and "Walling" from load-bearing walls. A type of foundation I've successfully used for sites in expansive soils whereby we approach the construction as a frame to the ground floor level then

progress using load bearing walls.

10. Which personal trait do you believe has been most essential to your success as an engineer?

It is definitely being reliable/dependable.

11. If you could invent a gadget to simplify life, what would it do?

The gadget would be used to actively listen to your everyday interactions and help in scheduling activities and reminding you of what you ought to do based on your interactions.

12. If you woke up tomorrow with a brand-new talent, what would you hope it is?

Being a very good swimmer.

13. If you could instantly learn a new skill (non-engineering), what would it be?

Writing computer codes

14. If one day you were asked to summarize your engineering journey in one word/phrase, what would it be?

Inspiring

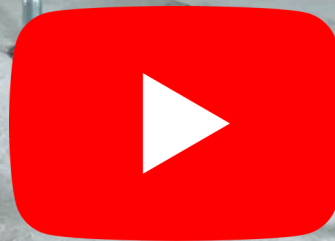
